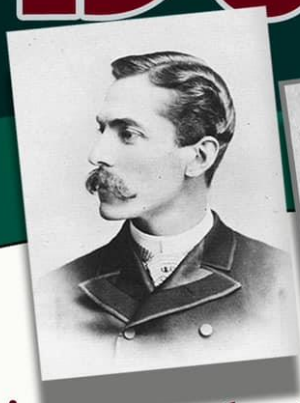


Durant Days
